<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Contextualize</b> (using your own prior knowledge)</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) After examining this document, what can we say for sure about the world in which it was created?</li> <li>2) Do you know of other events, people, and places from this era? List them</li> <li>3) Using this information, what deeper meaning can you extract from this image? In what context can you place this image?</li> </ol>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Corroborate</b> (by formulating questions)</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) To what use would you put this image as a historian?</li> <li>2) What questions do you have that would help you understand this image further?</li> <li>2) What evidence (primary or secondary) would help you answer your questions?
