Catherine Denial, Assistant Professor of History, Knox College in Galesburg, IL, and Bringing History Home Project Historian

Dr. Denial's research focuses on gender, sexuality, race and nation-building in the United States, especially before 1865. She explores ways in which contact between different cultures took place in disparate times and places. Since 2001, as Bringing History Home project historian Dr, Denial has helped K-12 teachers in Iowa and Illinois design instruction centered on primary sources.
